Crane Safety Training St Catharines - Both crane operator as well as their supervisors need to be aware of all the possible issues related to the use of an overhead crane. All over North America, there is legislation which provides regulation for the safe maintenance, operation and inspection of lifting equipment. Crane Safety courses actually help crane owners and managers accredit their drivers in accordance with provincial legislation.

We have designed some training courses in order to equip operators with the knowledge and skills needed to make crane lifting safer and easier. Operator training really helps to extend the crane's life span by ensuring high performance and safe operation of the crane.

Articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity can only be operated by accredited operators. Operators have to know regarding the features and operational characteristics of the equipment. Prior to use, a pre-operational machine check must be carried out. There is a legal requirement to perform a pre-operational check and a check of the work-site ground and overhead conditions.

The manufacturer's instructions provide information regarding inspection and maintenance, loading and unloading of the crane. The law requires daily and annual inspections. Operators have to maintain an up-to-date logbook in most places. They might be needed to validate machine warranties.

It is suggested that companies include remote control devices to their cranes. Remote control improves safety by allowing the driver an easier option for handling the crane.

Improving crane safety would normally help a company's bottom line. Such companies which follow safe equipment practices would usually see greater cost savings than businesses which don't. The risk of personal injury and equipment damage is greatly reduced when an operator who is well-trained is handling the crane. Safety conscious operators are much more productive leading to less times required for loading and unloading.
