Correct forklift training must comprise some areas of study, like theory and hands-on practice. Rules do not require employers to have an outside organization to certify forklift drivers.

A quality forklift certification school would include a suggested program that involves classroom training and hands-on training that is performed on-site. The training sessions inside the classroom include videos, power point presentations, discussions and models. Students typically should write a test to check for comprehension of subject matter. Certificates of completion are issued upon successful completion of the class.
