Forklift License St Catharines - In North America, acquiring a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators may get a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machine that is designed together with various alternatives, such as stand-up and sit down models, propane and electric versions, and various types and sizes to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training programs are normally individualized to be able deal with the specific uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck inside a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck within a shipyard. The different lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but instead on the results of individual training courses.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common way for operators to acquire their forklift certification or license. This method of certification needs the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machines within the workplace. Employers may opt to train workers on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The course incorporates forklift operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety measures and company rules. Topics specific to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each kind of forklift on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process would typically consist of an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

Usually, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the current employer to the next employer. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training permits the operator to run a forklift for that employer only.

Forklift safety will always be an essential factor of the forklift license training, although the particulars of the safety training will be dependent upon the machinery being used. Several safety problems will vary for every employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, such as in offshore and marine operations.
